Jesus knew that Lazarus death, burial and resurrection that Jesus was about to cause, was in front of a crowd of people eager to see what Jesus was going to do about his best friend lying in the grave.

Jesus knew this tomb was a stone's throw from the Temple in Jerusalem where Jewish religious leaders hated him and sought to murder Him, so this amazing resurrection of Lazarus would set in motion the events leading to His crucifixion in one week.

"Jesus Wept" because his days on earth were ending in a week, so He would never again enjoy being with the people He loved dearly, never share meals and conversation with them, never dance or worship with them

again, so HIS grief erupted in weeping for HIS loss of HIS beloved friends and family, AND for their loss they had no idea was about to happen.

Jesus knew it is worth it all. We who know Him know it also. Jesus WEPT from grief. We grieve and weep. There is healing in our tears, His tears and our tears.
