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AMERICAN HEALTH CARE DECISION TREE

Confusion is never from God, so why is there so much confusion over American Health Care decisions?

This *Decision Tree* is the only way to determine what YOU want.

DECISION 1... do you truly want Free Market health care in America or do you want Government health care? You must choose ONLY a or b...they are diametrically opposed to each other and cannot coexist. It is one or the other, as any attempt to combine the two in any way is not possible. Choose A or B...

- A. **Free Market**...this system is created solely by individual consumers of health care and their choice of providers of their personal health care at costs mutually agreeable between those parties. While insurance companies organize groups to serve these consumers, each individual chooses what plan if any they choose to pay for that best suits their personal needs at a price for just what they want to pay for, and not pay for any other person's health care except their own and that of their immediate family. The Free Market system gives freedom of choice to the individual to pay only for the health care they want and need at a cost they alone determine is Fair Market value from their choice of providers. Insurance companies create plans based on estimated costs of care, which is much lower for groups of persons young and healthy than higher costs for those older or have pre-existing health conditions.
- B. Government...this system is created by government attempting to provide a one size fits all health care system that covers costs of every person for everything. It forces individual consumers to pay the costs of their own health care and pay the costs for health care of other people, either through taxes or premiums paid to insurance companies. In this system, healthy individuals in their 20's and 30's who have lower actual costs of health care must pay for the higher costs of health care of persons with preexisting conditions or older persons under 65 that are not covered by Medicare. This system is totally opposite from Free Market. It is dependent on forcing some people to pay the costs of other people. This system merges the lower costs of care for some people with higher costs of care for other people, so every person pays the same insurance premiums, obviously penalizes younger healthy people to subsidize the higher costs of older persons or persons with existing health problems.

DECISION 2... if you choose Free Market...

- Do you want to pay for health care services directly with providers as you (or your family) need them or join a group of persons with similar circumstances as you are in currently, known as an insurance policy where you pay monthly premiums you choose only for the services you want to pay for personally?
- Do you want Government to stay out of the delivery of health care in America entirely, or fund the costs of health care for others from your taxes or higher costs of your own health insurance premiums?

DECISION 3... if you choose Government...

- Do you want Government to make all decisions about your personal health care or do you want to make those decisions with your Doctor in private...actually you gave up this right to choose by choosing Government instead of Free Market, as Government will dictate to doctors what they must do and how much they will be paid to do it and you will pay the costs for the services and the costs of Government employees hired to dictate to you, your doctors, your hospital, your pharmacy, your insurance company.
- Do you want to pay for the health care services for other persons unrelated to you or your family?
- If you do want to pay for the health care costs of other persons, do you want to do it by paying taxes or higher costs of your monthly personal insurance premiums?
- Do you want Government to FORCE persons who do NOT want to pay or cannot afford to pay, for the health care services of persons unrelated to them, to pay for it anyway and deny individual freedom of choice, giving Government all power to control Health Care in America?

There you have it. Make your decision personally. Let your Congress person know your decision.
